



The courtyard had been neglected for several years and was in dire need of help to make it a nice place for the staff and patients and visitors to enjoy. We were fortunate to receive a grant from Piedmont District and the Metropolitan Landscape Design Grant from Richmond Council to cover our budget of over \$1,000.

We had 3 major workdays to get everything cleaned up, debris removed, 18 pots of flowers planted, 27 herbs planted in a raised garden, and install 6 hostas, daylilies, a trellis, 2 new umbrellas and stands, 8 new cushions for the chairs, a new blue birdfeeder and ceramic blue birdbath, a garden flag, and a new water hose and reel. We labeled all the plants so patients will know what is planted. How beautiful and colorful the courtyard looked! The patients and staff loved it!
