April Gardening Tips

Half the interest of a garden is the constant exercise of the imagination. --- Alice Morse Earle

DAFFODILS

Make notes of early, mid and late bloomers in the landscape. Using markers, place in the ground where you might want to add new varieties, colors in the fall.

ANNUALS

Begin to research annuals that might enhance flowerbeds and pots. Cosmos, zinnias, impatiens are excellent choices for color and long blooming time.

ROSES

As new growth emerges on roses, mix a slow release rose fertilizer into soil. Once leaves unfurl, unproductive canes can be removed. Climbing roses are pruned after flowering.

AZALEAS

Azaleas are plentiful in nurseries. Color, leaf size and growth habit can be determined in spring, an ideal time for planting. Fertilize azaleas after blooming but not later than July 1.

LILACS

Cut dead wood from lilacs and remove spent blossoms. Feed with dehydrated manure and lime. Cut oldest stems to the ground after flowering.

MAINTENANCE & TIPS

- Prune spring bloomers after flowering, summer bloomers now for shape and health of plants.
- Fertilize daffodils with 5-10-5 after blooms have faded.
- Add a layer of hardwood mulch, leaf mulch or pine needles to trees and beds.
- Spray boxwood with strong water to remove pests
- Check weather forecast for late frosts, usually 4/15 to 4/20.


