Good luck with your yard/garden clean-up, pruning and plant care.



Landscape Shrub of the Year 2021 by Proven Winners



 $Kodiak_{\odot}$  Orange Diervilla, is an eco-friendly, native alternative to burning **bush**. It's a very durable shrub and easy care. It has beautiful orange foliage in the spring and fall and tiny yellow flowers in the summer. This attractive shrub attracts pollinators and is drought tolerant and deer resistant.

The Perennial Plant Association – Perennial Plant of the Year 2021



The Calamintha Nepeta has tiny white flowers that appear from early summer to fall on this beautiful plant. Calamintha Nepeta is a perennial herb of the mint family. It's a very showy shrub with upright leafy flowering stems that are 12' to 18' tall.
