## **RCGC Proposed Budget for 2021-2022**

The proposed budget for 2021-2022 is attached. It will be voted on at our annual meeting. The totals for receipts and disbursements remain the same with changes shown in **red**. We anticipate receiving enough dividends so that we will not be dipping into our checking account as in the past. The Donation to RCGC Habitat for Humanity Fund is replacing the Landscaping Grants for completed houses. This donation will become part of the Habitat Fund that we have been receiving donations for to help pay for some of the cost of landscaping the habitat houses. The Bonding Fee & Insurance cost has increased to \$680 and the \$60 increase was taken from the PO Box fee which we have cancelled.
