RICHMOND COUNCIL OF GARDEN CLUBS MINUTES OF SEPTEMBER MEETING September 10, 2021

The September meeting of Richmond Council of Garden Clubs was held at the Atlee Library in Mechanicsville in person for officers and committee chairmen and via Zoom for others. Due to the illness of President, Linda Hardwicke, the meeting was conducted by First Vice President, Judy Erdman.

Judy called the meeting to order at 10:30 a.m. She opened the meeting with the pledge of allegiance to the flag and the Lord's Prayer. Judy and Jean Fender were the only 2 present along with the speaker, but approximately 15 tuned in on zoom which constituted a quorum.

A motion was made to dispense with the reading of the minutes of the June annual meeting. Jean Fender gave the Treasurer's report for the period June 1, 2021-August 31, 2021. The balance in the checking account is \$16,581.72 which includes \$447.12 in the Habitat for Humanity Fund. We also have our investments in Davenport and TradePMR and 3 certificates of deposit. Jean reminded 6 clubs that she had not received their dues.

Jean received 2 newsletters and a letter from Nature Camp thanking us for our donation we mailed them in May. Two of the campers that were helped with these funds had written thank you notes which were read. Jean also said she had received thank you letters from the City of Richmond, Powhatan, and Chesterfield for the school gardening donations we had sent them. Jean briefly told about the Habitat for Humanity project completed by Hilliard Park Garden Club, West Hanover GC, Clay Springs GC, and Town and Country GC. She sent articles into the RCGC newsletter, Footprints, and the Old Dominion Gardener publications which all gave RCGC credit for fully funding the project.

Judy explained that the October meeting will feature Brent Heath on Daffodils. We will let everyone know if we can meet in person or have our meeting and program on zoom.

There was no other business and Judy introduced our speaker, Heidi Molano from Boulevard Flower Gardens to present our program. Heidi decorated a ribbon with dried flowers to be used as a hat band and also made a small dried arrangement in a glass covered container. She then made three lovely fall flower designs which were to be raffled off but Jean and Judy were the lucky recipients.

The meeting and program were over by 12:30 pm.
