Hilliard Park Garden Club

Completes Mediterranean Garden at Christ Lutheran Church Submitted by Jean Fender, Hilliard Park Garden Club

Hilliard Park Garden Club recently completed landscaping a 2 part courtyard in the back of Christ Lutheran Church in Lakeside using grant money from Piedmont District and from Richmond Council of Garden Clubs' Metropolitan Landscape Grant. The courtyard which had not been tended to for a number of years is now a beautiful Mediterranean Garden with a focal point on the smaller side of 3 different size pots sitting on pea gravel with cone flowers and creeping jenny and the smaller pot lying on its side with sedum flowing from it. Close by is an agave plant which will showcase the garden as it grows. Also in that part of the courtyard we planted 2 large yucca plants, daylilies, cockscomb celosia, and creeping phlox.

The larger side already had a nice size crepe myrtle tree, 3 small shrubs, and a beautiful small blue spruce shrub. We had previously rebuilt 2 wooden benches located near the church building and now placed pots of hens and chickens sitting on pea gravel beside them. We planted rosemary in front of a recently built wooden barrier hiding mops. Other plants installed included 5 blue fescue, 3 autumn joy sedum, Mexican feathergrass, daylilies, a rose of sharon shrub, pittosporum shrub, and creeping phlox along the edge of the sidewalk. Along the rail fence by the handicap ramp, we planted cockscomb celosia, black and blue salvia, 3 purple monarda and daylilies.

Seven of our 12 members and one husband helped with the landscaping along with two men from church.
