### Richmond Council of Garden Clubs, Inc. Meals on Wheels Program Procedures for 2022-2023

Following are the procedures that apply to the Meals on Wheels project.

Council will give financial assistance to member garden clubs who make flower arrangements for Meals on Wheels recipients. The following guidelines apply:

- 1) Clubs will be given 50 cents per arrangement, totally up to \$20.00 per club.
- 2) Requests for reimbursement are to be made to Meals on Wheels Chairman after arrangements are completed. Use the application shown below.
- 3) Written documentation must be given to the treasurer prior to the check being written to the club.
- 4) RCGC will only make one payment, per fiscal year to a club participating in the Meals on Wheels project. Clubs are encouraged to participate in the Meals on Wheels project independently.
