School Gardening/Youth Gardening

Dear Members and Friends,

In the past several years members of RCGC have given generously to the School Gardening program. Your gift is very important as is allows us to support the efforts of the Cooperative Extension in Richmond, and the counties of Chesterfield, Hanover, Henrico and Powhatan. The Extension is sponsoring programs such as outlined in our National Garden Club that inspire and educate our youth. The thank you letters received from the Extension Offices shared that the funds were being used for class gardening programs; gardening story books for elementary schools; enhancement of horticulture outreach which includes composting, pollinators, butterfly gardening programs for youth; 4-H clubs hands on horticulture projects to youth at no cost to participants. This is just a taste of where the funds so generously donated by RCGC are being utilized. In the past 5 years the numbers of clubs that have donated to this worthwhile program have fluctuated from 3 to 10. Total dollar amount collected ranges from \$400 -\$1,125. For this coming year, I challenge each club to find funds within their budget to contribute to this very worthwhile program. RICHMOND COUNCIL OF GARDEN CLUBS MINUTES OF NOVEMBER 4, 2022 MEETING

The meeting was held at Ginter Park Presbyterian Church. President Judy Erdman called the meeting to order at 10:30 a.m. After sharing that Gladys Bowles was in the hospital, President Erdman led the pledge, the Garden Collect and gave a Thanksgiving Invocation.

The minutes of the October meeting were included in the newsletter. There were no corrections. Jean Fender gave the Treasurer's report. The balance in the checking account as of September 1, 2022 was \$27,440.61. There was income totaling \$527.18 and disbursements of \$825 which left a balance as of October 31, 2022 of \$27,142.79. The total for investments was \$396.454.66. There were no corrections.

Julie Proctor thanked Crown Grant Garden Club for their refreshments.

Johanna Gilbert gave the Attendance report: 20 clubs were represented and 45 members attended.

It was noted that Mary Frances Gravitt's name was misspelled in the yearbook. Mary Frances will be assisting Jean Fender in Awards and Grants.

Habitat for Humanity chairman, Jean Fender reported on recent work to landscape a Habitat house done by Hilliard Park Garden Club. Jean shared the plan used with a drawing and pictures before and after completion. Old Ivy Garden club will be working on landscaping a Habitat house on Nov. 19. If you are interested in helping, please contact Jean Fender or Carole Hopkins, President of Old Ivy. RCGC reimburses \$300 for the project. Jean Fender reminded members that clubs can apply for grants like the J. Malcolm Pace Award or Metropolitan Landscape Projects Grant for their spring projects.

The yearbook corrections were in the newsletter and any further corrections will be in the December newsletter.

Conservation Chairman Evelyn Klumb reminded members that small steps in caring for and protecting nature can make a difference.

Kay Rafner, chairman of Life Membership reminded members to contact her if your club wishes to honor someone with a Life Membership. The money goes to support Nature Camp.

Barbara Covington stated that 11 pounds of tab tops were donated to Ronald Mc Donald House. This donation not only supports Ronald McDonald House but is a way to protect and conserve the environment.

Pat Merson had a flat tire and was unable to be with us but sent a reminder that Fashion with Flowers will be held at First Baptist Church in Richmond on the first Friday in May.
