RICHMOND COUNCIL OF GARDEN CLUBS MINUTES OF February 3, 2023

The February meeting was held at Ginter Park Presbyterian Church. President Judy Erdman called the meeting to order at 10:30 a.m. President Erdman reminded members that due to the death of beloved chaplain Gladys Bowles, a new chaplain will be needed and she would appreciate any suggestions or names of people who might be interested.

President Erdman gave the Invocation and led the Pledge of Allegiance.

Julie Proctor thanked Clay Spring GC for the refreshments.

Johanna Gilbert reported attendance: 19 clubs represented and 47 members present.

The minutes were included in the newsletter and there were no corrections.

Jean Fender, treasurer, gave her report: there wasn't a January meeting so the balance in the checking account as of Dec.1, 2022 was \$27,172.77. The income was \$15,988.36 and disbursements totaled \$1,439.68. The balance in the checking account as of Jan.31 was \$40,721.45. A CD of \$100,000 matured during this period and was moved to a CD at M&T Bank with \$11,000 in interest added to the checking account. The total of all investments is \$386,460.38.

Hilliard Park GC received \$30 for the arrangements they created and took to nursing homes.

Richmond Habitat for Humanity contacted Jean with the hope of finding help for houses being built in Richmond city, Chesterfield and Henrico counties. Richmond Habitat has funds and manpower to help clubs in these areas create landscaping for Habitat houses. A list of the houses will be sent to Jean Fender and will be included in the newsletter.

Awards chairman Mary Francis Gravitt reported no application have been received but asked that clubs look and take advantage of the opportunity. The deadline is April 1st.

Judy Durant thanked members for bringing in their Tab Tops for Ronald McDonald House.

Evelyn Klumb, Conservation chairman, alerted members to the VAConservationNetwork.org which has information about climate, energy, water, etc. and interesting recipes and places to recycle. Evelyn reminded members to feed and water the birds and wildlife.

Youth Gardening: Janice Beatty reported a wonderful \$500 donation from a family to support this program. The VA Extension Service helps educate children about gardens and growing things. The skills learned can help in life as well as lead to job opportunities in the future. This is a worthwhile cause to support financially and as helpers when asked.

Horticulture chairman Jackie McDonnough reminded members who are beginning to plan gardens to get their soil tested before planting. Jackie shared that Lewis Ginter has a Seed Bank and members can get 6 seeds from the bank as well as donating their seeds. Also, the Library at Lewis Ginter has a wonderful selection of books, some of which came as a donation from RCGC's former library. When RCGC sold the house, they gave their Library to a very new Lewis Ginter as they were starting.

Horticulture Therapy-Shirley Berger stated that our connection with Meals on Wheels doesn't seem to be working at the moment but making arrangements for nursing homes and shut in friends are good alternatives for clubs.

Nature Camp-Sandra Walker encouraged members to spread the word and send in applications for Nature Camp.

Fashion & Flowers-Pat Merson reported this event will be Friday May 5 at First Baptist Richmond and more details will be in the newsletter.

President Erdman asked members to think about ways to make meetings more interesting and to encourage members to attend.
