School Gardening

Dear Members and Friends,

In the past several years members of RCGC have given generously to the School Gardening program. Your gift is very important as it allows us to support the efforts of the Cooperative Extension in Richmond, and the counties of Chesterfield, Hanover, Henrico and Powhatan. The Extension is sponsoring programs such as outlined in our National Garden Club that inspire and educate our youth. The thank you letters received from the Extension Offices shared that the funds were being used for class gardening programs; gardening story books for elementary schools; enhancement of horticulture outreach which includes composting, pollinators, butterfly gardening programs for youth; 4-H clubs hands on horticulture projects to youth at no cost to participants. This is just a taste of where the funds so generously donated by RCGC are being utilized.

In October, I shared pictures of local youth at various educational activities we helped to fund. At the November meeting I shared a letter RCGC received from Virginia Tech thanking us for our donation to help with the cost for programs specifically designed for the children/youth in our communities. The monies we provide make a difference for these children.

In the past 6 years the number of clubs that have donated to this worthwhile program have fluctuated from 3 to 10. The dollar amount collected ranges from \$400 -\$1125. For this coming year, I challenge each club to find funds within their budget to contribute to this very worthwhile program.

To date we have only received donations from two Garden Clubs for the Youth/School Gardening Program. If each club participles with their donations, then the children are the winners.

Minutes of November 3, 2023

President Judy Erdman, called the meeting to order at 10:30 am. In absence of the chaplain, Judy led the Lord's Prayer and Pledge to the flag.

Bonnie Parker gave the report on attendance: 87 members, 26 clubs and 1 guest. A quorum was declared so the meeting could proceed.

Minutes were published- no questions so the minutes were filed.

Jean Fender gave a treasurer's report of \$34,608.36 on hand as of October 30, 2023. Jean said \$247 was raised on the sale of containers last month.

Jean Fender gave a habitat for humanity report. She said 5 new homes in Ashland on Taylor and Arlington streets will be built and the kick off will be November 11, 2023.

Jean Fender also reported the wreath shop in Mechanicsville will give 10% off on Veterans Day.

Awards-A grant of \$500 from RC land grant is available to apply for to help with the benches at the new Feed More Courtyard.

Janice Beatty School Gardening chairperson, said \$392 was given to surrounding counties and cities for school gardening. She read a letter from VT thanking the council.

Horticulture Therapy- Arrangements for designs being delivered to Meals on Wheels recipients, nursing homes or similar recipients to benefit the elderly or disabled will be paid \$2. Forms are available on RCGC website: https://rvagardenclubs.com/ServiceProjects.html

Erica Gilliam reported on gently used costume jewelry to be sold to make money for RC. If club members will bring the jewelry, the committee will bag and label the jewelry for sale.

Next month the speaker will be Frances Thrash. Frances will do a program on Christmas designs. Meeting was adjourned.
