Horticulture

As temperatures start increasing and the summer growing season begins, here are a few simple things that can keep your yard in perfect condition.

Turfgrass

- Cool-season lawns can be fertilized.
- Warm-season lawns may be fertilized now.
- Seeding of warm-season grasses such as bermudagrass, zoysiagrass, and centipedegrass is best performed in mid-May through the end of June.

Trees and Shrubs

- Watch for Bagworms on junipers, Elm leaf beetles on elms, and Lace bugs on sycamores and azaleas.
- Soak new transplants and newly planted trees unless rainfall is abundant.
- Protect trees from lawnmowers and weed eaters by mulching.

Flowers

- Annual bedding plants can be set out for summer color.
- Plant summer bulbs such as canna, dahlias, elephant ear, caladiums, and gladiolus.

Fruits and Vegetables

- Plant watermelon, cantaloupe, cucumber, eggplant, okra, etc.
- Fruit spray programs should be faithfully continued during the next several weeks.

RCGC Minutes of the April Meeting/Fashion with Flowers April 5, 2024

The Money Market account balance on March 1 st was \$10,020.46 with interest income of \$34.99 creating a balance of \$10,055.45. The total in Investments as of February 29, 2024 was \$401,773.39.

Crown Grant GC received a check for Horticulture Therapy arrangements.

The budget for 2024-2025 will be voted on at the Annual meeting in May.

President Proffitt reminded clubs that an email has been sent from the Hospitality chairman to club presidents for next year's hospitality hosting. A response needs to be sent as soon as possible so the list can be included in the 2024-2025 yearbooks.
